The Foshay South competitions are sanctioned as Bronze competition members of Equine Canada (EC), 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K-1Y6 and are governed by the rules of EC. Every class offered herein is covered by the current rules and specifications of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

Equine Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All Persons shall be committed to:

- ☐ upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- ☐ requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ☐ ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- ☐ providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- ☐ providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- ☐ continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- ☐ requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- ☐ actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Code of Conduct

EC rules address the following general areas:

- Welfare of the horse
- Safety of horse and human athlete
- Administration of competitions (see also Competitions Administration Policy)
- Code of conduct for officials and competitors
- Drug and medication control
- Individual breed and discipline rules

SHOW RULES

Administration:

- 1) All entry forms due no later than five (5) days prior to the show as entries may need to be limited in some classes for safety and management purposes.
- 2) Any late entries received after 5 days prior to the show date will be charged an additional administration fee of \$35.00 per horse.

- 3) All information must be completed and all forms signed for the entry to be accepted.
- 4) Drop off or mail show forms to: Foshay South Eventing 21 Gallagher Road Lakeside, NB E5N 7K2
- 5) Make all cheques payable to "Foshay South Eventing Inc". Credit cards also accepted (Visa, MC) as well as interact payments.
- 6) Email and faxed entries are accepted with credit card or interact payment. A \$3.00 processing fee will be applied with credit card payments. Email suzannestevenson@nb.sympatico.ca; Fax # 506-696-4403. Please email in advance of sending faxes to ensure received.
- 7) All payment must accompany entry form(s). As well as copies of Bronze sport license, NBEA membership, negative coggins (within 2 years) and proof of vaccinations (Flu, Rhino. Tetanus). No post dated cheques accepted. NSF cheques will be charged \$50 administration fee.
- 8) All entries must be made in writing (Article A801.4). The show numbers will not be issued if all the required signatures are not complete.
- 10) Hunter Classes are paid by division only whether you enter one or all classes.
- 11) Jumper Classes are paid for on a class basis.
- 12) Post entries will be accepted up to one hour prior to the class and will be subject to an additional \$5 charge per class or division.
- 13) Scratches will not be reimbursed.
- 14) Official protests must be made in writing to the secretary of the competition, signed and accompanied by a \$100.00 cash deposit within 48 hours of completion of the class, Equine Canada Article A1206.
- 16) Prizes for 1st place, Ribbons – 1st to 6th place. At August show Championship prizes awarded to high point Horse/Rider combination accumulated from both shows for Intro and Beginner Hunter, Jumper Divisions and the Mini-Prix. Other championship prizes may be given if entries in other divisions are large enough.
- 17) Equine Canada Rule A814: Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in show ring and in exercise areas.
- 18) Show Committee reserves the right to measure any pony or horse entered in the show.
- 19) Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equine Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the Equine Canada Rule Book. Any incident requiring a ruling which cannot be referenced to the EC Rule Book, will be rendered by the Show Committee.
- 20) **If less than four entries are received for any class, the show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.**
- 21) "The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC or USEF Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC or USEF Rules for any rule violations. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. **A:** For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition. **B:** For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR."
 The PR must be an EC Sport Licence Holder in good standing and/or a provincial federation member in good standing.
 In the case of junior entries, a parent/guardian is entitled to sign as PR and must be at minimum, an EC Registered Participant in good standing.
 Registered Participant:
 Any person registered with Equine Canada, including Sport Licence Holders, and paying dues to obtain some benefit from Equine Canada.

The cost of a registered participant/non-competitive licence is \$15. However, please note that all provincial equestrian federation members automatically receive EC registered participant status.

- 22) Management has the right to expel any rider, owner or spectator deemed to be in their sole discretion disruptive to the show at any time.
- 23) Dogs must be leashed or caged while on the show grounds. The Owners are solely and expressly responsible for their dogs and the dog's behavior. Owners of loose dogs will be charged \$75.00 to retrieve their pets.
- 24) Absolutely "NO" smoking permitted on show grounds.
- 25) The show office will open one (1) hour prior to the start of the show and close 1/2 hour at the end of the show.
- 26) Bronze classes do not require passports or Jump Canada Levy. Bronze Sport licenses are required for all Bronze classes and can be purchased at www.equinecanada.ca. They will also be for sale at the show office on the day of the show.

Services Offered

- 1) A limited number of Box Stalls are available at a cost of \$40.00 per stall per night, bagged shavings available for \$7.00 per bag. Stalls are to be cleaned out at the end of the show. First priority will be given to exhibitors traveling from outside the Saint John/Sussex area.
- 2) Hay is available at \$5.00 per bale.
- 3) Warm up area will be available on the show grounds.
- 4) Foshay South main ring is 235' x 155'.
- 5) There will be a canteen on the grounds as well as food services available in Hampton.
- 6) Warm up classes will be available for the start of the jumper division and at the beginning of each hunter division. Cost is 10\$ per round and tickets are available at the show office or at the in-gate.

Directions:

To get to Foshay South from Saint John take the Hampton exit and turn Right onto Hall Road. From Sussex turn Left onto Hall road. Follow Hall road for a few KMs and turn Right onto Kelly St where the junction has a bank of mailboxes. Go ½ km and turn Left onto Alison St. Go ¼ km and turn Right onto Gallagher Road. The farm is just ahead on the left 21 Gallagher Road.

Exhibitor Requirements

- 1) Equine Canada Bronze Sport License and NBEA membership are required to compete in Bronze classes. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (Article A404). Equine Canada Bronze License is NOT required for exhibitors competing only in Lead Line.

- 2) Exhibitors are to send a photocopy of the rider's Equine Canada and owner's Equine Canada number as well as NBEA membership with the entry form.
- 3) Bronze memberships may be purchased online at www.equinecanada.ca. Your receipt will be proof of memberships. Temporary one-day memberships are no longer available.
- 4) Any horse, entered in any class at a competition, may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing. (Article A1006)
- 5) Copies of negative Coggins test must be included with the entry. Coggins tests with a stamped date within **last 2 years** will be accepted.
- 6) Copies of proof of vaccinations for tetanus and flu are required for each horse. Strangles vaccine is recommended for showing on the grounds and appreciated if stabling at Foshay South.
- 7) Non-showing horses: All horses brought on the property during the competition must have a signed entry blank and owners/riders must have a current NBEA membership. Anyone riding non competing horses which have been brought on to the show grounds must wear a number issued by the office.
- 8) Passports for the horses are not required.
- 9) As per Equine Canada rule article A805, the Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, except as provided in A805.2 (a, b, c, d, e).
- 11) The show will refund 50% of the entry fee less the fees for classes completed if the horse entered is withdrawn due to unsoundness or sickness provided a veterinarian's certificate is produced, dated no later than the closing day of the show and received within 10 days of the show date.
- 12) All riders, grooms, attendants and handlers must be neatly dressed on entering the ring. ARTICLE G109 DRESS. Dress code for jumpers G109 – polo shirts are acceptable attire in the jumper ring.

SAFETY RULES:

- 1) ARTICLE G102 HEADGEAR
 - a. At all EC-sanctioned competitions, **all competitors**, including foreign competitors in EC National classes, must wear approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.
 - b. Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.
 - c. Failure to comply with G102.1 in the exercise area and/or the competition arena will result in the following penalties:
 - i. 1st violation at competition: warning.
 - ii. 2nd violation at same competition: disqualification from the competition and forfeiture of all fees and prize monies.
 - d. EC makes no representation or warranty expressed or implied about any protective headgear and cautions riders that serious injury or death may result despite wearing such headgear as all equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risk and adds no protective helmet can protect against all foreseeable injuries.
 - e. All violations which occur outside the competition arena will be reported to the judge/jury who will levy the applicable penalty.
 - f. All violations which occur in the competition arena will be acted upon by the judge(s) who will levy the applicable penalty.

- g. For all competitors, if the harness comes undone or the hat falls off, the rider must retrieve and/or do up the hat, with assistance if necessary, before the next obstacle is taken. There will be no penalty other than the loss of time. Failure to do up the harness or retrieve protective headgear immediately results in elimination.
- 2) The show committee does not accept responsibility for accidents or illness to horses, riders, grooms, spectators or any other persons.
- 3) Exhibitors competing for provincial points are requested to enter the animal in the name of the member of the family who is the official Equine Canada member.
- 4) **ARTICLE G101 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES**
It is mandatory that all national and provincial competitions have on site emergency medical services with a minimum of advanced first aid and basic cardiac life support (BCLS). Jumping in competition and warm-up areas should be suspended if the sole medic onsite is handling an emergency she/he cannot leave.
- 5) **ARTICLE G103 FALLS**
After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring. Any rider who does remount in the ring after a fall will be eliminated from all classes in that ring for the remainder of the day. A rider who remounts after a fall and takes another obstacle will be disqualified from the remainder of the show.
- 6) **ARTICLE G104 IN-GATE**
In all classes, trotting or cantering through the in-gate without prior permission is forbidden. The penalty for contravening this rule is either a fine or elimination from the class, at the discretion of the judge. Under special circumstances, a steward or judge may give permission for a horse to trot into the ring, but not out of the ring.
- 7) **ARTICLE G105 STALLIONS**
 - 1. Junior B and C riders must not ride or handle stallions anywhere on the competition grounds. Jr. A riders may ride manageable stallions in jumper classes only.
 - 2. Manageable stallions ridden by seniors are eligible for all senior classes.
- 8) **ARTICLE A808 and G501 HORS CONCOURS**
 - 1. "Hors Concours" entries may be accepted at the competition committee's discretion but are subject to the same scoring rules as a regular entry with respect to falls, elimination etc. Such entries are not judged and are not eligible for the jump off.
 - 2. A horse or pony that has competed "Hors Concours" is not permitted to be judged in the same ring on the same day. A horse or pony may only compete "Hors Concours" once in the same ring on the same day."
 - 3. "Hors Concours" entries will follow the last regular entry in the class.
 - 4. "Hors Concours" is not allowed in the EC Hunter Division.
- 9) Cell phones, IPODS, etc. are not recommended to be used while riding. See ARTICLE G114 COMMUNICATION
- 10) Any horse that becomes out of control shall be eliminated from the competition at the discretion of the judge.
- 12) Lunging will not be permitted in the warm-up ring if there is more than one rider in the ring.
- 13) Schooling Rules: reference Hunter/Jumper schooling rules see Annex 1 page 108 Section G rule book. FEI schooling rules will be in force.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition."

New Brunswick competitors require NBEA membership. Bronze Membership may be purchased from Equine Canada (www.equinecanada.ca) – printed receipt will be accepted for proof of Equine Canada membership. Passports and Jump Canada Levy are not required for Bronze classes.

Note: Horses Entering Hunter Divisions may only enter 2 of 3 divisions (i.e., Intro and Beginner Hunter OR Beginner and Heritage Hunter)

MISCELLANEOUS JUMPER DIVISION: (Not Rated for Equine Canada awards)

See Equine Canada jumper rules. Junior, amateur or non-pro riders may not compete in draw reins. G502. A horse/rider combination is permitted unlimited upward movement through divisions, but downward movement is restricted to only one level. These movements are based on the level of the first class in which they competed. G604.8

HUNTER DIVISIONS

INTRO HUNTER – Miscellaneous, not rated for Equine Canada Awards.

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize for first Ribbons 1st to 6th

12) Intro Hunter #1 – (Over fences: A simple hunter course of at least 8 fences with no combinations. Emphasis of judging on manners, obedience and style. Trotting to fences will not be penalized. Distances not to be adjusted for horses and ponies. Maximum height and width to be 22" (0.55m). Fences may be low verticals or oxers. Majority of fences to be 18" (0.45m). Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies of any height.

13) Intro Hunter #2

14) Intro Hunter under Saddle – (To be shown at walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. No more than eight to hand-gallop at one time. To be eligible horses/ponies must have completed the course in at least one fences class in their respective division.)

Entries in this division are limited to the Intro and Beginner Hunter Divisions. A pony ridden by an adult must not be shown by a junior in the same competition.

BEGINNER HUNTER– Miscellaneous, not rated for Equine Canada Awards.

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Prize for first Ribbons 1st to 6th

15) Beginner Hunter #1 – (To complete a hunter-type jumping course of at least 8 obstacles not to exceed 2'6" (0.75m) in height. To be judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going. Open to seniors riding horses or large ponies and juniors riding horses or ponies. The course may, but is not required, to be adjusted in height and distance for ponies.) Juniors of any age may show any height of pony in miscellaneous, non-point classes. G306.

17) Beginner Hunter under Saddle

HERITAGE LOW HUNTER – Miscellaneous, not rated for Equine Canada Awards.

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Prize for first Ribbons 1st to 6th

18) Heritage Low Hunter # 1: .9m 3' Open only to horses ridden by a Junior or Senior rider. Horses judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going.

HERITAGE HUNTER 3'3– Miscellaneous, not rated for Equine Canada Awards.

Entry Fee: \$60 for division (2 over fences and 1 under saddle)

Prize: Prize for first Ribbons 1st to 6th

21) Heritage Hunter 3'3 # 1: 1m 3'3 Open only to horses ridden by a Junior or Senior rider.

Horses judged on obedience, jumping form and general way of going.
22) Heritage Hunter 3'3 #2
23) Heritage Hunter 3'3 under Saddle

EQUITATION DIVISION

Equine Canada rule section G1001-1009

Entry Fee: \$20 per class

Prize: Prize for first Ribbons 1st to 6th

Equitation classes are divided by age groups as follows: Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Article A901.

Routine on the flat: Article G1007. Riders will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait – walk, trot and canter, reverse and repeat. At the judge's discretion, they may be asked to execute an individual test.

24) Jr. "A" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equine Canada

Riders are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.

25) Jr. "B" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equine Canada

Riders are such from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 13 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 15.

26) J. "C" Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equine Canada

Riders are such until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12.

27) Senior Hunter Seat (not to jump) Equine Canada

Members will be classified as Senior from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 19.

28) Lead Line Equitation (miscellaneous class not rated for EC awards). This class is open to children under 10 and not entered in any other class. An EC sport license is not required to enter this class.

ENGLISH HACK DIVISION

Entry Fee: \$20 per class

Prize: Prize for first Ribbons 1st to 6th

English Pleasure (E.C.) Article G1303

These 6 Hack Classes are all Equine Canada Point Classes

English Pleasure Article G1303

To be shown at a flat-footed walk, normal trot and easy canter and not to gallop; light contact to be maintained. To be judged on 45% performance, 40% manners and 15% conformation.

Road Hack Article G1302

Class Routine and Judging: a) Horses to enter ring at a walk. b) To be shown at a flat-footed walk with a reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. Only 8 horses to hand gallop at one time. c) To be judged on 55% performance, 20% substance, 15% conformation and 10% manners.

29) Pony English Pleasure E.C.

30) Pony Road Hack E.C.

- 31) Junior English Pleasure, E.C.
- 32) Junior Road Hack, E.C.
- 33) Open English Pleasure, E.C.
- 34) Open Road Hack, E.C.

SHORT STIRRUP DIVISION Miscellaneous, not rated for Equine Canada Awards.

Entry fee: \$40 for the division, or \$15 per class

Open to riders 12 years of age or under as of the current show year. Riders not to have shown over fences 18" or higher at an EC Sanctioned show. Riders may not cross-enter into any other class or division at the same show where they are required to canter. The division must include at least three of the following classes:

35) Walk-Trot Equitation

36) Walk-Trot Pleasure

37) Walk-Trot Figure Eight

38) Cross-Rails - 4 cross-rails under 18". Management is required to mark the judge's card and course description with the specifications of this class as "cantering is NOT required."

NOTE: Once a rider jumps 18" or higher in any EC Sanctioned Show, that rider is no longer eligible for Short Stirrup Division

Year End Equine Canada Bronze awards and NBEA awards will be presented by the New Brunswick Hunter/Jumper Association and the NBEA. Horse and rider must have competed in at least two Equine Canada Sanctioned competitions for your points to count. Year-end awards will be presented for each division. Details for all awards are found on the NBEA website at www.nbea.ca.



These classes are OPEN to ALL participants, pony club and non-pony club members. There is no age restriction for these classes.

PONY CLUB JUMPER DIVISION Miscellaneous, not rated for Equine Canada Awards.
